Summary of test

The sample(s) tested complies with the requirements of IEC 62368-1: 2018 and EN IEC 62368-1:2020+ A11:2020.

Unless otherwise specified, the EUT with model DS-D2049LU-Y was selected as representative model for full testing. The EUT with model DS-D2049UL-0A with PCB main board (model: 70707) and display (model: DV490FHM-NV4-D) was selected as representative model to verified Clause B.2.5 Input test, Clause 5.4.1.4, 6.3.2, 9.0, B.2.6 Temperature measurements, Clause B.3&B.4 Abnormal operating and fault condition tests, Annex Q. Circuits intended for interconnection with building wiring (LPS) and Clause 4.4.4.2 (T.5) Impact tests and Clause 4.4.4.4 (T.6) Impact tests for part testing.

EUT operation under maximum normal load:

Test with HDMI mode, the video signal is three vertical bar signals as defined in 3.2.1.3 of IEC 60107-1:1997, adjust the brightness and contrast to maximum value; USB load 0,5A.

All test data are based on SGS CB test report (Report Number: SUES240300017001, dated on 2024-03-18 and SUES240300017002-M1, dated on 2025-05-26, only update the test standard to IEC 62368-1: 2018, EN IEC 62368-1:2020+ A11:2020. After evaluation, only clause 5.7.4 Unearthed accessible parts was considered to perform on model DS-D2049UL-0A for the differences.











Details of: PCB-1 View





Details of: Power supply board






